
INTRODUCTION


This chapter provides an inventory and analysis of existing County Parks and Trails and Non-County Recreational resources. Analysis of the existing kinds of recreational resources available to county residents and their location helps provide the planning context for developing the Comprehensive Parks and Trail plan for Chisago County. A synthesis of this information along with the community input obtained from the public meetings on issues and opportunities, and background information on demographics and recreation trends provides the framework for the 2020 Chisago County Park and Trail Plan.

COUNTY PARKS

Chisago County operates and maintains approximately 793 acres of parks and trails. All of the County Parks are adjacent to water resources, marshes, streams or lakes.

In general, the parks in the northern section of the county are not extensively developed. Parks in the southern section tend to be more developed. The recreational opportunities offered in the northern parks is generally passive and consists of nature viewing and walking.

CHECKERBOARD COUNTY PARK

CLASSIFICATION: County Park

SIZE: 76 Acres

LOCATION: Four miles east of North Branch on Trunk Highway 95. Surrounded by residential uses, woods, and wetlands.

EXISTING FACILITIES AND ACTIVITIES:

- Hiking
- Picnic shelter
- Restrooms
- Grills
- Picnic tables
- Playground: slide, merry-go-round, swings, hanging bars, shovel
- Volleyball
- Horseshoes
- Swimming Beach
- Parking lot.

PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS:

- Possible expansion to include adjacent wetland.


ADJACENT LAND USES: wetland, wooded, residential.

COMMENTS: Checkerboard County Park is located east of North Branch on Trunk Highway 95. It is popular for active and passive recreation and has one of the County Park system's swimming areas. Opportunities for games such as volleyball and horseshoes are present. This park is less crowded than other parks in the county. Surrounding wooded area may be developed for residential use.

DENNIS FRANDBEN COUNTY PARK

CLASSIFICATION: County Park

SIZE: 117 Acres

LOCATION: North Shore of Rush Lake, near Rush City. Surrounded by rural residential and agriculture.

EXISTING FACILITIES AND ACTIVITIES:

- Fishing pier
- Picnic tables
- Lake access and roughly two miles of shoreline
- Shelter

PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS:

- State grant application for park amenities submitted in 1999, 2000 and 2001.

ADJACENT LAND USES: Agricultural, wooded, residential.

COMMENTS: Two miles of shoreline. Popular for fishing. Few site improvements to date, but a master plan has been prepared. It does not receive the usage that other Chisago County Parks do; however, it is very popular as a shoreline fishing location. Therefore, it has fewer site improvements than other parks in the system. It does provide an extensive shoreline along Rush Lake and its off-the-beaten track aspect has its own appeal.

FISH LAKE COUNTY PARK

CLASSIFICATION: County Park

SIZE: 152 Acres

LOCATION: West Shore Of Fish Lake, near Harris. Surrounded by agriculture and rural residents.

EXISTING FACILITIES AND ACTIVITIES:


- Swimming beach
- Boat Launch
- Hiking
- Cross-country skiing
- Two picnic shelters with electrical service, grills, picnic tables
- Restrooms
- Playground: slide, merry-go-around, swings
- Lake access: winter and summer.
- Lake side bench seating

PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS:

- Playground improvements
- Possible expansion along south shoreline.

ADJACENT LAND USES: Wetland, wooded and residential.

COMMENTS: Fish Lake County Park is located on the east Shore of Fish Lake. It is very popular and provides the best swimming beach within the Chisago County Park system. The park can be crowded on summer weekends. The park has the most building structures within the park system. It is popular for ice fishing and for its swimming beach. It is located close to Harris and has excellent access to Interstate Highway 35.





KI-CHI-SAGA COUNTY PARK

CLASSIFICATION: County Park

SIZE: 98 Acres

LOCATION: South of Lindstrom off County Road 25. Near Lindstrom. Surrounded by rural residential, agriculture, and a game refuge.

EXISTING FACILITIES AND ACTIVITIES:

- Historic Karl Oskar house
- Hiking
- Cross-country skiing
- Three softball fields
- One picnic shelter with electrical service
- Grills
- Picnic Tables
- Playground: play structure
- Volleyball
- Horseshoes

PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS:

- Accessibility path to shelter, two soccer fields in 2001, one picnic shelter, potential additional parking.

ADJACENT LAND USES: Agricultural, wildlife refuge, wooded, residential.

COMMENTS: Ki-chi-saga County Park is located on the south shore of South Center Lake. It is located close to the Chisago Lakes area, which is the county's biggest population center. It is popular for active and passive recreation and has one of the county's historic homes, the Karl Oscar house. The park has the largest number of softball fields within the County Park System. An added attraction is the abutting wildlife refuge, which affords wildlife viewing opportunities from trails within the park.







KOST DAM COUNTY PARK

CLASSIFICATION: County Park

SIZE: 27 Acres

LOCATION: Between North Branch and Lindstrom off County Road 14 and 15. Surrounded by agriculture and rural residential.

EXISTING FACILITIES AND ACTIVITIES:

- One interpretive shelter
- Grills
- Picnic Tables
- Play Area: slide, swings
- Restrooms
- Bank fishing

PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS:

- Playground equipment
- Possible park expansion to the north and east.


ADJACENT LAND USES: Agricultural, wooded, residential.

COMMENTS: Kost Dam County Park is located on the south branch of the Sunrise River. Important historic site. It is a picturesque spot that takes advantage of the sights and sounds provided by Kost Dam. The park is located between North Branch and the Chisago Lakes. It is popular for passive recreation as a picnic and fishing site.

COUNTY TRAILS

SUNRISE PRAIRIE TRAIL

CLASSIFICATION: County Trail

SIZE: 24 miles (through Chisago and Washington Counties.)

LOCATION: South of Wyoming to North Branch. Follows the original Burlington Northern Railroad line constructed in 1867-1870. Passes through areas of hardwood forest, deep marsh wetlands, the Sunrise River and the town of Wyoming and Stacy. Surrounded by various rural and urban areas.

EXISTING FACILITIES AND ACTIVITIES:

- Bituminous trail for biking, in-line skating, hiking.
- Parallel-unpaved trail for snowmobiles and horses.
- Picnic and parking facilities

PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS:

- None planned

COMMENTS: This trail follows the abandoned-northern railroad right-of-way. It connects to the Hardwood Creek Trail in Washington County.

NON-COUNTY RECREATIONAL PROVIDERS

There are several “outside resources” influencing recreational opportunities offered to Chisago County residents. In addition to the Chisago County Park system, there exist many municipal parks, state and federal parks/lands and private recreational providers. This section outlines these comparable recreational providers within Chisago County. These providers are private and publicly owned and offer facilities and amenities that may have an influence on future planning for the Chisago County Park and Trail system.

FEDERAL AND STATE MANAGED PARKS/AREAS


Upper and Lower St. Croix National Scenic Riverway


In 1968, the St. Croix River north of Taylor’s Falls was designated as a National Wild and Scenic River. Then the portion of the River south of Taylors Falls received the same designation in 1972. The National Park Service and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources developed management plans for the designated areas. This area offers scenic opportunities.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources-Natural Areas Carlos Avery Wildlife Management Area

The DNR manages this 23,000-acre area of upland forests, grassland, fields and wetland marshes lying on the Anoka Sand Plain. The WMA was established for wildlife production, public hunting and trapping and “other uses compatible with wildlife management” in Northeastern Anoka County and Western Chisago County for wildlife purposes. The area contains 57 miles of roads and more than 23 miles of trails and fire breaks. The forest and grassland areas are managed through selective cutting, controlled mowing and burning, planting of food plots, and tree planting. Wetland areas in the WMA are maintained using a system of dikes and control structures, prescribed burning and level ditching.

The area is a haven of rare animal species, including wolves and eagles and Sandhill Cranes. The primary public recreational use of the Carlos Avery WMA is the hunting and trapping of waterfowl, deer, squirrel, mink, muskrat, raccoon and beaver.





State Lands



Interstate State Park

Interstate State Park is 293 acres in size and was established in Minnesota in 1895 and Wisconsin followed suit and established its own state park across the St. Croix River in 1900. Visitors can see at least ten different lava flows, fossil remains of ancient creatures, and tracks of various creatures and ripple marks left in stone by now vanished seas. The magnificent glacial formation of the park makes rock climbing a favorite recreational activity for many visitors to the park. The park also provides camping sites and facilities and canoeing opportunities.

Wild River State Park

Wild River State Park was established in 1978. Nearly 5,000 acres of the Park's 7,008 acres were donated by Northern States Power Company. Approximately 10,000 years ago, the melting of the last glacier formed Glacial Lakes Duluth and Grantsburg; these lakes supplied the waterpower to create the present day St. Croix Valley. Like other parks in the county, this too was a popular logging area years ago. Among the variety of recreational activities available at the Park are over 35 miles of hiking and skiing trails.

Chengwatana State Forest


The Chengwatana State Forest was established in 1953, and encompasses about 29,000 acres in Pine and Chisago counties. About 17,000 acres are publicly owned. It contains a variety of outdoor recreation facilities, including Snake River Campground (Pine County) hiking and skiing trails, and snowmobile trails. The Minnesota-Wisconsin Boundary Trail crosses the State Forest and will eventually connect the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area to Duluth. Primary uses of the trail are hiking and snowmobiling, and some sections are used for horseback riding. During the winter, the trail connects Chengwatana, St. Croix State Park, and St. Croix and Nemadji State Forests.

MUNICIPAL PROVIDERS

Almelund-City Parks

Carl Almquist Field

This park features a softball and baseball field.



Triangle Park

Triangle Park consists of green space with a monument dedicated to Swedish Pioneers.

Center City –City ParksWater Tower Park

Water Tower Park is located at 150 Busch Avenue. It provides a picnic area, a playground area that includes swings, slides, a merry-go-round, skating rink and a volleyball court. It is small and is only a half-acre in size. (The most popular park in Center City.)

I.G. Long Park.

This one-acre park is located at the intersection of Nelson Lane and Nelson Court. It provides a playground area, with swings, a slide, jungle gym, canoe access and fishing.

South Park

This 3-acre park is undeveloped and built on four peninsulas located at South Center Lake, North Lake and Pioneer Lake but does have picnic tables. This park used to be a popular swimming beach back in the 1940's. Now it cannot be used as a swimming beach.

Chisago Lake Lutheran Church Park

Adjacent to the Church is a two or three acre park with a softball and baseball field

Chisago City-City ParksChuckie Lundquist Park


Chuckie Lundquist Park was dedicated in the 1960 's and is 3.3 acres in size. It provides an ice rink with a warming house and facilities for tennis, baseball, softball and basketball activities.

Dahl House Park

This tot lot was built in the 1960's and was furnished by the Chisago City Booster Club. It has some minor playground equipment and is the site of well #3. This park is one tenth of an acre in size.


Vilhelm Moberg Park

This park was formerly known as Central Park and was dedicated as Vilhelm Moberg Park in 1997 by the King and Queen of Sweden. This park is mainly used as the Gateway to the Chisago Lakes Area and as a community-meeting park. It is two acres in size and provides facilities for

picnics and special events, which include playground equipment, a pavilion, benches and a drinking fountain.

Paradise Park

Paradise Park was built in 1992 with a grant from the Minnesota DNR. This is the largest of the City Parks and is on the site of the former Paradise Resort.

Triangle Park

Triangle Park is the site of the Ernest Hawkinson memorial.

Chisago City-Natural Areas

Waterpower Park

Watertower Park was created in 1998. The Park consists of a few minor walking trails. As the park is mostly wetland, there are no plans to develop this park.

Harris City-City Parks

Firemen's Park

This one-acre park is located off of Co Rd. 9 and provides facilities for volleyball, a horseshoe pit, a picnic shelter, grills and swings.

Schoolyard Park

This four-acre park is located off of County Road 9 and provides a picnic shelter, horseshoes, volleyball, basketball, and a tennis court and playground area.

Stark field Park


This large field located on County Road 10 offers softball and baseball activities and has bleachers and a concession stand.

City of Lindstrom-City Parks

Library Park

Located on the West end of Newell Ave *(Behind the Lindstrom Public Library) Size: .5 acre

Features: picnic facilities, brand new play equipment and swings, . Restrooms. Specific Equipment1 handicap swing, 3 belt swings, 1 composite structure with 1 slide and 1 overhead event.



Lindstrom Beach Park

Located on South Lindstrom Lake, at the West end of Newell Ave. *(South of the Dinnerbel Restaurant) Size: 3 acres

Features: sand beach, swimming area, boat tie-up, fishing pier, sand-pit volleyball, shelter, picnic tables, charcoal grills, swings, playground equipment with separate play for toddlers, drinking water, portable toilets, winter access for ice fishermen, paved walking paths. This park and all of its amenities are all handicapped accessible.

Specific Play equipment: 1 preschool structure with 1 slide. 1 composite structure with 3 slides and 2 overhead events. 1 tot swing, 1 handicapped swing, 2 belt swings

Lion's Park

Located adjacent to Lindstrom City Hall on the east end of Sylvan Ave Size: 5.5 acres

Features: a small island accessible by a covered foot bridge, playground equipment, pavilion, much open green space, picnic tables, drinking water, electricity, portable toilets for general use and new, conventional bathrooms for community hosted events.

Specific Play equipment: 1 composite structure with 2 slides & a tire swing. 2 teeter-totters

North Meadow Park

Located on Co. Rd 19, West of Hwy 14. *(North west of Tom Thumb) Size: 2.2 acres

Features: Green space for soccer and baseball, picnics, half-court basketball, tetherball, separate play equipment for elementary and preschool ages, drinking water, and portable toilets. Completely handicapped accessible.

Specific Equipment:. 1 tot swing, 1 handicap swing, 2 belt swings, 1 composite structure with 2 overhead events. 1 composite structure with 3 slides. 1 children's table with roof.

Pleasant Hill Park (F.K.A. "The Hollow")

Located on Pleasant Ave. *(South of the Break on 8 coffee shop)

Size: 64 acre

Features: ball diamond and winter sledding opportunities.

Pump House Park

Located on 3rd Ave and Co. Rd 20 *(North of Interstate Lumber)

Size: 1.25 acres

Features: ball diamond, soccer practice board, state-of-the-art half-court basketball, open green space for football, picnic tables, portable toilet, new playground equipment and swings with wheelchair accessible surfacing in the play area.

Specific Equipment: 1 tot swing, 1 handicap swing, 2 belt swings, 1 composite structure with 1 slide and 2 overhead events.

Skate Park

Located on the East End of Sylvan Ave *(South of the cemetery)

Size: 2.2 acres

Features: lighted hockey and pleasure-skating rinks with warming house and speaker system for music. .

Specific Equipment: None except rinks.

Town & Country Park

Located on 299th and Neal Ave. *(1 mile South of the Dairy Queen and 1 block East) Size: 4.5 acres

Proposed to begin spring of 2001.

Future Proposed Features: nature area with benches, picnic area, paved 2-lane circuit for running, walking, skating, bikes, tricycles etc., 3 separate play areas and equipment for teens, elementary, and preschool. Plan includes half-court basketball, tetherball, sandpit volleyball, swings, tire swing, portable toilets, drinking water, and open green space.

City of North Branch-City Parks & Natural Areas

Branch Acres

This open space is undeveloped and located in a neighborhood at 394 and Henna Avenue

Central Park

Central Park consists of 2.4 acres and has playground equipment, a hard court surface (basketball) permanent buildings, a pavilion/shelter, and a picnic area. It is located at the intersection of Hwy 95 and 8th Avenue.

Chain Lake


This 0.6-acre undeveloped open space features a lake access (no boat landing). Located on 412th St.

Duck Creek

This 1.6-acre park is undeveloped open space with bird feeders. It is located off of County Road 13.

Harder Park

Harder Park is a 60-acre park and features 40 acres of wetlands and is located east of downtown on TH95. The remaining twenty acres provides four (4) baseball fields, play equipment, horseshoes, a basketball court, pavilion/shelter, and a picnic area. It is located off of Harder Avenue north of Hwy 95.

Parks: North Branch



North Branch Oaks

This 2 acre area is forested and undeveloped. It is located on 366th St.

Northwoods

Northwoods is a 5.5-acre park located at Sioux Trail and Chippewa Avenue. It is handicapped accessible and features playground equipment, tennis courts, hard court surface (basketball) a pavilion/shelter, and picnic area.

River Walk Park

This park is located along the Sunrise River and features ½ mile to 1-mile gravel trail, a pavilion/shelter and a picnic area. It is located between Grand Avenue and County Road 30.

Tower Field

This 4.9-acre park is located under the east water tower features two-baseball fields, a pavilion/shelter, and picnic area. It is located along Cougar Trail.

Rush City-City ParksRush City Park

This small 100 ft by 350 ft. Park located at 250 South Dana Avenue (northwest corner of the intersection of Dana Avenue and Fourth Street (Trunk Highway 361) features a covered pavilion with a cement floor and picnic shelter, swings, playground equipment and a restroom.

Rush Creek Park

This park is approximately 7 acres in size and is located at 600 Harte Avenue. This park is a nature park with some walking trails along the creek.

City of Shafer-City Parks & Natural AreasIce rink


This rink is located on 302nd St. and is used for skating.

Open Space

This green space is located along Redwing Avenue and is improved with flowers and provides benches.

Mechanics Park

This park is an undeveloped area in the former industrial park.



Playground Park

Playground Park is located on 303rd St. and provides playground equipment, swings, and a basketball hoop

Tee Ball Field (not city-owned)

This field provides facilities for tee-ball. It is located on Redwing Avenue

City of StacyRick Doyle Memorial Field

This park features softball fields south of Stacy.

Stacy City Park

This twelve-acre park is located east of I-35 on CR19. This park features a ball field, playground equipment, sledding hills, ice skating rink, warming house and a picnic area.

City of Taylor's FallsLions North Park

This two-acre park provides a boat landing, picnic areas, grills and volleyball.

South Park

South Park provides a boat landing, picnic areas, grills and volleyball.

MN/DOT (under bridge) Under the Highway 8 Bridge Park.

This park provides benches, picnics areas and a view platform.

City of Wyoming-City Parks & Natural AreasAshton Park


Ashton Park is .6-acre in size and is located at 26110 Galen Drive. This park provides a fenced playground and a picnic area.


Centennial Park

Centennial Park is .7 acre in size and is located at 266947 Fenwick Avenue and provides picnic tables, grills, small storage building, and flagpole and memorial plaques.

Kunshier Park

This 6.8-acre park is located at 5560 Flint Trail. This park is undeveloped/unused at this time. Part of the property determined to have





possibly unstable ground due to past back filling of trees stumps and other debris.

Lions Park of Wyoming

Lions Park is a half-acre park and is located at 4800 263rd St. This park provides one ball field, a picnic shelter, picnic tables, grills, playground, basketball half court and a parking lot that converts to a skating rink for winter use. This park is also lighted.

Railroad Park

Railroad Park is located at 5280 East Viking Blvd. and is almost an acre in size. This park features a City Welcome sign, picnic tables, and drinking water, next to the Sunrise Prairie Trail, which is a 10-foot paved multi-use, trail extending from North Branch to Hugo.

St. Paul's Church Park

This 7.6-acre park is located at 5879 Wyoming Trail. This park is owned by St. Paul's Lutheran Church and cooperatively developed with the City as a park. This park features a basketball court, a playground, picnic tables, a ball field and trail crosses through the park.

Sunrise Park

This 6.5-acre park is located at 5220 274th Street. This park features a ball field, picnic tables picnic shelter, volleyball court, playground, native wildflower and grass are and a paved path from the parking lot into the township.

Swenson Park


This 4-acre park is located at 26910 Flintwood Avenue. This provides tennis courts, a playground, picnic tables, baseball field and rail crosses through the park.


Thurnbeck Park/Fedje Fields

This 15-acre park is located at 26000 Goodview venues. The park currently features two ball fields and a picnic area. Future planning in process to develop this park jointly with Wyoming Township as a large multi-use recreational area.

Water Tower Park

This .6-acre park is located at 26725 Felton Avenue. This park provides a small playground area, picnic tables, and water tower well and pumps house/maintenance building.





Other Wyoming Areas

Wyoming Elementary though not a City Park is within the City limits and has several ball fields and a large playground area. Other areas include several short trails/paths, various out lots, city properties and right-of-way throughout the city.

Locate in Taylor's Falls along the St. Croix River.



Wild Mountain


This year round park offers summer and winter activities: skiing and snowboarding, alpine slides, Taylor's Falls Scenic tours, canoe rental and campground facilities.
